<u>Equip your Student</u>

To do their best learning, students need some basic supplies, and should come to class prepared with these items each day. Charlton Middle provides each student with a multi-pocket <u>red folder</u> and an <u>agenda</u> which is an essential organizational tool, and also a method of communication between home and school. These should be brought to every class, every day along with an <u>SSR Book</u>. Other materials needed for classes include:

ELA	Composition notebook, pencil, SSR book
MATH	3 Single subject spiral notebooks, pencil, glue sticks, Math Text, Dry Erase Marker, Folder
SCIENCE	Notebook, pencil, Science Text, SSR book
GEOGRAPHY	1" to 2" binder (to be kept in class), Single Subject Notebook, pencil, SSR book

The classroom pencil sharpeners don't work well and can disrupt class, so hand sharpeners are always appreciated!





Encourage Good Behavior

Each student is expected to follow the school rules, which are clearly stated in the Middle School Handbook. We, as a team, feel that respect for others is of utmost importance. If the rules are not followed, logical consequences will follow based on the nature of the situation, which may include:

Warning	Change of seat
Teacher/Student conference	Parent Contact
Detention	Teacher/Parent/Admin Conference

While it is important to have the above plan in place should behavioral issues arise, we work to prevent such events from happening by fostering a community of learners, by teaching and practicing procedures with students, and by positively reinforcing good behavior daily.

Support Good Homework Habits

Homework will never be "busy work." Often it is used as part of an activity in the next day's class and if incomplete, students miss out on learning opportunities. For example, they may not get to share and discuss their answers with a partner, or they might not get to play a game that uses flashcards made as homework. We will design assignments to reinforce concepts taught in school, to allow for practice with the concepts, or to prepare for assessments. By establishing a quiet, clear space in the home as well as a chunk of time dedicated to the jobs listed in the agenda, you will be helping build responsibility and good tomorrows for your 6th grader. We thank you for your support with this!

Should a student miss an assignment due to absence, they should make up the work as soon as they are able to. Classes are always moving forward and new assignments may pile up on top of old ones which can become overwhelming for 6th graders! The maximum amount of time allowed for assignments missed due to absence is outlined in the middle school handbook.
